

The MICHAEL PRIZE

For the best contribution to scientific and clinical research which promote further development in epileptology.

The MICHAEL PRIZE was awarded for the first time in 1963 to stimulate epilepsy research in Germany; it is now one of the most highly regarded international awards for the best contribution to scientific and clinical research promoting further development in epileptology.

The MICHAEL PRIZE is awarded biennially and specially designed to attract younger scientists normally not older than 45 years of age. The prize fund is 20.000 Euros.

For the MICHAEL PRIZE 2011, up to a maximum of three papers in English language may be considered, at least one of which - published or not yet published - must be from the period 2009/2010.

The publications or papers, together with a curriculum vitae, should be submitted by electronic mail to STIFTUNG MICHAEL before December 31, 2010. References are not required.

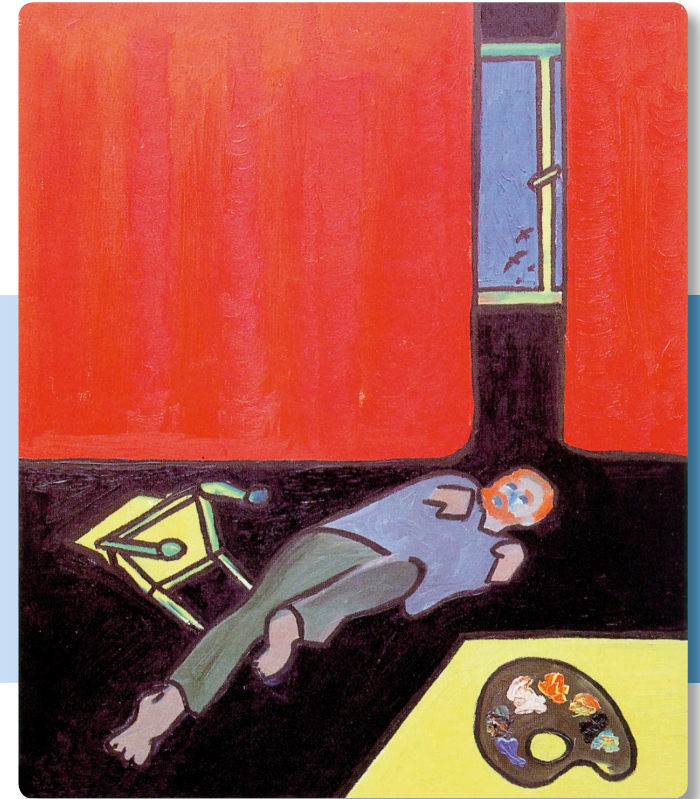

STIFTUNG MICHAEL was founded in 1962 by Dr. Fritz Harzendorf, a well known journalist and editor. Its main aim is to support scientific research on the most effective treatment methods as well as the causes of all illnesses associated with seizures, and to fight against the individual and social consequences of epileptic diseases.

STIFTUNG MICHAEL has the following main objectives

- stimulation of international epilepsy research through the MICHAEL PRIZE and the organization of the MICHAEL FORUM – a biennial meeting of the MICHAEL PRIZE winners for an exchange of experiences and information on new research projects
- training of medical doctors from Germany and other countries, and of social workers in the specific field of epileptology
- providing financial and organisational support for epilepsy stations and centres
- providing information through publications on epilepsy and its social problems
- offering financial and organisational support for epilepsy self help groups and for social work in epilepsy

has been officially acknowledged as a private non-profit organisation; it does not receive any government subsidies.
